

The Deerfield Regional Storm Water District was formed by Deerfield Township in October 2003 to address storm water quality and quantity issues within the Township. By 2008 the Township, through the District, must be in compliance with specific provisions of the Federal Clean Water Act. The District has been working toward this goal as well as studying other storm water problems within the Township.

In 2005 the Deerfield Regional Storm Water District:

- Collaborated with Warren County Soil and Water Conservation to provide Storm Water Education within the schools and to the public in general.
- Contracted with Camp Dresser & McKee, Inc. for engineering consulting services.
- Formed a Storm Water Advisory Committee consisting of Deerfield Township residential and business representatives to develop a five year storm water plan addressing both water quality and water quantity issues and to suggest funding sources. The Board accepted this committee's recommendations in November.
- Retained Albers Law Offices for ongoing legal consul.
- Hired an administrative assistant.
- Installed stream signage through the Township Public Works Department at 16 stream crossings.
- Staffed a booth at Deerfield Day to distribute storm water information to the community and raise public awareness of storm water issues.
